Pastor's Note

A SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR SHROVETIDE

Three more days and we will be observing Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Holy Fast of Lent. Since the discipline of

Lent is supposed to aid us in dving to self-will and "standing on our rights" I would like to offer the following Scripture verses for our consideration:

And when they were come to Capharnaum, they that received the didrachmas came to Peter and said to him: Doth not your Master pay the didrachmas? He said: Yes. And when he was come into the house, Jesus prevented him, saying: What is thy opinion, Simon? The kings of the earth, of whom do they receive tribute or custom? Of their own children, or of strangers? And he said: Of strangers. Jesus said to him: Then the children are free. But that we may not scandalize them, go to the sea and cast in a hook: and that fish which shall first come up, take: and when thou hast opened its mouth, thou shalt find a stater: take that and give it to them for me and thee. -Matthew 17:23-26

The matter at hand is this. The Pharisees held that every Jewish male over 20 had to pay 2 drachmas a year for the support of the Temple in Jerusalem. There is an element of coercion here, hence Peter replies "yes" in a reflexive defense. Christ lays out a short parable for Peter to understand the truth of the matter. (Remember this is after Peter has made his Confession on Jesus' real identity: Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God (Matthew 16:16).) Therefore Jesus as the Son of God is not bound to give tribute to the Temple. Nonetheless, in order not to give cause for scandal, Jesus conforms to the pharisaical custom. In a wonderful way the Lord tells Peter the fisherman how to procure a *stater*, the Greek coin worth 4 drachmas, in order to pay



the Temple Tax for both of them.

Catholic commentary on this episode from St. Matthew's Gospel sees this as an example of Christ exercising the virtue of humility. While at other times He goes against the Pharisees when there is a question of doing good for someone (for example, healing the sick on the Sabbath), in this instance He appeases them by going along with the custom, and for the express purpose of not giving them cause to take offense.

An application for our own conduct is this: When it is not a question of being prevented from doing a deed of mercy for someone and when a moral principle is not at stake, at times it is good for us to give way to the preferences of others in order to prevent a quarrel, or keep the peace, or foster good will. These small acts can also be an exercise of social duty or social charity. A good Lenten resolution then: look for opportunities to renounce self-will.

CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

The LOURDES CATECHISM

<u>February 11th, 1858: The First Apparition</u> <u>Thursday in Sexagesima Week</u>



The photograph above shows the great rock nicknamed the "Massabielle" as it appeared at the time of the Apparitions, 1858. It was inside the cave of this rock, the grotto, where Bernadette Soubirous saw the vision of a mysterious young girl who turned out to be Our Lady, Mary Immaculate.

As we can see by comparing this photo to the later construction of a large church over the grotto, the Massabielle has been much "tamed" in order to create a visitors' shrine. At the time of the Apparitions, however, it was anything but tame. It was a forbidding, unfriendly place. People were accustomed to letting their pigs roam there so it was further associated with unpleasant things: for example, people who had bad manners were described as people who got their manners from Massabielle. On the Thursday before Lent, which was the Thursday in Sexagesima Week, Bernadette Soubirous, a 14 yr. old girl from an impoverished Lourdais family was scavenging for driftwood with her sister and another girl by the riverbank. (It was also *Jeudi Gras*, *"Fat Thursday"*, the first day of the annual Carnival revels which took place in the days before Ash Wednesday.)

Bernadette had been left behind by the other two girls after they had crossed the River Gave. The Angelus bells at Lourdes had just rung the noon Angelus when Bernadette heard the sound of a wind, as if in a storm, but no trees were moving. All that moved were the branches and brambles underneath the topmost opening of the grotto.

There Bernadette saw: "... A girl in white, no bigger than myself, who greeted me with a slight bow of the head ... She was wearing a white dress reaching down to her feet, of which only the toes appeared. The dress was gathered very high at the neck by a hem from which hung a white cord. A white veil hung over her head and came down over her shoulders and arms almost to the bottom of her dress. On each foot I saw a yellow rose. The sash of the dress was blue and hung down below her knees. The chain of the rosary was yellow: the beads white, big, and widely spaced. The girl was alive, very young and surrounded with light ..."

In the Liturgy of the Divine Office for Sexagesima Week the account of the Great Flood in the time of Noah is read from the Book of Genesis. On the Thursday of Sexagesima Week, the Lesson tells of how God placed a rainbow in the heavens as a sign of his new Covenant with Noah (Genesis 9:12-15).

May we not see the first appearance of Our Lady Mary Immaculate at Lourdes on Thursday of Sexagesima Week as another sign of God's Covenant with mankind, and that the rainbow in the heavens after the Great Flood was itself a type of Mary as a sign of hope?

LENTEN REGULATIONS

CURRENT DISCIPLINE Days of Abstinence Begins on one's 14th birthday. Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. **Obliges abstention from** flesh meat.

Days of Penance Applies to all the Faithful. Lent and Fridays outside of Lent.

Days of Fast Everyone aged 18-59. 1 full meal permitted, two other meals may be taken which, when combined. are less than a full meal. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

(The obligation to do penance is lifted on Fridays which are also celebrated as a solemnity: e.g., Christmas Day).

OLDER DISCIPLINE Days of Abstinence Applies on one's 7th birthday. **Complete Abstinence on** all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, and the Vigil of Christmas. Partial Abstinence (meat and soup, or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at principal meal) weekdays of Lent, Ember Days of Wednesday & Saturday, Vigils of Pentecost & Assumption. (Abstinence dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation.)

Days of Fast Everyone aged 21-59. Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday on, Ember Days, Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost and the Assumption. One full meal permitted, with 2 smaller meals.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 13. 1-13 Brethren: If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal. And if I should have prophecy, and should know all mysteries, and all knowledge; and I should have all faith so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And if I should distribute all my goods to feed the poor, and if I should deliver my body to be burned and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing. Charity is patient, is kind; Charity envieth not, dealeth not perversely, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, seeketh not her own, is not provoked to anger, thinketh no evil, rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth with the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Charity never falleth away; whether prophecies shall be made void, or tongues shall cease, or knowledge shall be destroyed. For we know in part, and we prophesy in part. But when that which is perfect is come, that which is in part shall be done away. When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child. But when I became a man, I put away the things of a child. We see now through a glass in a dark manner; but then face to face. Now I know in part; but then I shall know even as I am known. And now there remain faith, hope and charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity.
