HOLY WEEK, 2021

CATECHESIS: ON-GOING INSTRUCTION IN THE FULLNESS OF CHRISTIAN FAITH

The LOURDES CATECHISM

The Second Sign at Lourdes: "I am the Immaculate Conception"



The first sign given at Lourdes was the spring of water flowing from the side of the rock of the Massabielle. It was a figure of the water and blood flowing from Christ's side on Good Friday: the Baptismal Regeneration of the Easter Sacrament.

The second sign was the Visitor's revealing of her name to Bernadette: "I am the Immaculate Conception." This occurred on March 25th, 1858. It was the Feast of the Annunciation, the beginning of our Redemption, when the Word became Flesh in Mary's Virginal Womb.

Our Lady spoke to Bernadette in the girl's

local dialect, the *patois* of the Pyrenees Mountains: Her exact words were *QUO SOY ERA IMMACULADA CONCEPCIOU*. Being only rudimentarily catechized Bernadette did not understand its meaning. She could only memorize the sound of the words to repeat them to the Pastor of Lourdes who immediately grasped their import.

Mary's self-identification with her singular



privilege of sinlessness hearkens back to the Proto-Evangelium of Genesis 3:15: "I will put enmities between thee and the woman, and thy seed and her seed: she shall crush thy head, and thou shalt lie in wait for her heel." Mary's Immaculate Conception contains within it the whole Redemption story. In her preservation from sin, Mary is the sole representative of the original justice of the human creature before sin entered the world. She is also the vision of the future of the Saints in Heaven, where there is no stain of sin left. All has been washed clean.

It is significant therefore that Thursdays play a key role in the sequence of the Lourdes Apparitions. For those who have sinned (all of us), the way to Heaven by innocence is no longer an option. Instead, we are bound to follow the way of penance.

In the Lenten liturgies Thursdays are the day of the week most emphatically focused on penance and penitents. The Lenten Gospel which coincided with the Feast of the Annunciation in 1858 was the Lesson for Thursday in Passion Week. It is the Gospel of the *peccatrix*, the sinful woman who interrupts Christ's dinner at the house of a Pharisee and, with tears of sorrow and love, anoints Christ's feet with precious ointment. She is a figure of the sinful, redeemed human soul who personally receives the tender mercy of the Lord.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: PASSION SUNDAY

INTROIT: Psalm 42: 1-2 Judge me, O God, and distinguish my cause against an ungodly nation: O deliver me from the unjust and deceitful man: for Thou art my God and my strength. *Psalm* 42: 3 O send out Thy light and Thy truth: they have led me and brought me unto Thy holy hill, even unto Thy tabernacles.

COLLECT We beseech Thee, almighty God, mercifully look upon Thy family: that by Thy great goodness it may be governed in body and by Thy protection be preserved in mind. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: Hebrews 9: II-15 Brethren: Christ being come, an High Priest of the good things to come, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is, not of this creation: neither by the blood of goats or of calves, but by His own blood, entered once into the Holies, having obtained eternal redemption. For if the blood of goats and of oxen and the ashes of an heifer, being sprinkled, sanctify such as are defiled, to the cleansing of the flesh: how much more shall the blood of Christ, who, by the Holy Ghost, offered Himself unspotted unto God, cleanse our conscience from dead works, to serve the living God? And therefore He is the Mediator of the new testament: that by means of His death, for the redemption of those transgressions which were under the former testament, they that are called may receive the promise of eternal inheritance, in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GRADUAL: Psalm 142: 9, 10; 17: 48-49 Deliver me, O Lord, from my enemies: teach me to do Thy will. *Psalm* 17: 48-49 My deliverer, O Lord, from the angry nations: Thou wilt lift me up above them that rise up against me: from the unjust man Thou wilt deliver me. TRACT: Psalm 128: 1-4 Often have they fought against me from my youth. *V*. Let Israel now say: often have they fought against me from my youth. *V*. But they could not prevail over me: the wicked have wrought upon my back. *V*. They have lengthened their iniquities: the Lord who is just will cut the necks of sinners.

GOSPEL: John 8: 46-59 **A**t that time, Jesus said to the multitudes of the Jews: Which of you shall convince Me of sin? If I say the truth to you, why do you not believe Me? He that is of God heareth the words of God. Therefore you hear them not, because you are not of God. The Jews therefore answered, and said to Him: Do not we say well, that Thou art a Samaritan, and hast a devil? Jesus answered: I have not a devil: but I honour My Father, and you have dishonoured Me. But I seek not My own glory: there is One that seeketh and judgeth. Amen, amen, I say to you: If any man keep My word, he shall not see death for ever. The Jews therefore said: Now we know that Thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets: and Thou sayest: If any man keep My word he shall not taste death for ever. Art Thou greater than our father Abraham, who is dead? and the prophets are dead, whom dost Thou make Thyself? Jesus answered: If I glorify Myself, My glory is nothing: it is My Father that glorifieth Me, of whom you say that He is your God, and you have not known Him: but I know Him: And if I shall say that I know Him not, I shall be like to you, a liar. But I do know Him, and do keep His word. Abraham your father rejoiced that he might see My day: he saw it and was glad. The Jews therefore said to Him: Thou art not yet fifty years old: and hast Thou seen Abraham? Jesus said to them: Amen, amen, I say to you, before Abraham was made, I am. They took up stones therefore to cast at Him: but Jesus hid Himself, and went out of the temple.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 118: 17, 107 I will confess to Thee, O Lord, with my whole heart: render to Thy servant: I shall live and keep Thy words: enliven me according to Thy word, O Lord.

SECRET May these offerings, we beseech Thee, O Lord, loosen the bonds of our wickedness, and procure for us the gifts of Thy mercy. Through our Lord.


