Pastor's Note

JUBILEE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

December 8th of this year. This Jubilee commemorates the 150th Anniversary of the Proclamation of St. Joseph as the "Patron of the Universal Church." (Coincidently, 1870 was also the year of the establishment of this parish as St. Mary's of Newton and Needham.) The background to the Proclamation was the immediate aftermath of the armed conquest of Rome, the Pope's city, by Vittorio Emanuele, King of Sardinia. The ecumenical Council going on in the Vatican at that time had to be abruptly discontinued and the Catholic bishops from around the world made a hasty exit.

It is hard for us Catholics today to appreciate what a cataclysmic event this was at the time and how it called into question the whole basis for the Catholic Church's continued organizational structure. Over centuries, since late Antiquity, the Bishops of Rome had acted as the temporal rulers of their domain in tandem with their spiritual rule. The imperial city of Rome and its environs made up a jurisdiction known as the Papal States. At times, these Papal States were quite extensive across the Italian peninsula. Catholics also called this Papal sovereignty the "Robe of Peter". Like a garment, the Pope's political independence was both a protection and an acknowledgment by the Christian kings and princes of Europe that the Pope, as the Vicar of Christ, submitted to no secular power.

However imperfectly this worked in practice, the principle remained, and the Papal States had their secure place in the world order of Europe throughout the Middle Ages and into the Modern period. Then came the "Age of Revolution" with the French Revolution in 1789. Twice the Popes were overthrown and their Papal States abolished, first by Napoleon I and

then by the wave of Revolution which swept across Europe in 1848. Each time stronger European political powers restored the Pope to his sovereignty. The alignment of revolutionary spirit and Italian nationalism, however, proved to be too strong a force to resist.

Papal sovereignty was cast as the obstacle to Italian national unity. Pope Pius IX was derided as the "Vampire of Italy", sucking the nation's life-blood dry. By 1870, the Pope's sovereign state had been reduced solely to the city of Rome, protected by France. When France met with sudden and humiliating defeat at the hands of Prussia and the German coalition in 1870, the King of Sardinia saw his opportunity and he took it.

Vittorio Emanuele declared himself the King of the new Kingdom of Italy with Rome as his capital. Pope Pius IX was unceremoniously dethroned as the temporal ruler of Rome. Thereafter began the era of the reigning Pope as the "Prisoner of the Vatican", an era which did not definitively end until Pope John XXIII made his pilgrimage outside of Rome to the Holy House of Loreto just before the opening of the Second Vatican Council in October of 1962.

It was in the midst of this great uncertainty for the Church's future that Pope Pius IX, "Pio Nono", proclaimed another title for St. Joseph as "Patron of the Universal Church." At the beginning of his reign Pius IX had introduced a new feast into the Church's calendar, the "Patronage of St. Joseph", which was to be celebrated on the Third Sunday after Easter each year. This feast was now blended with St. Joseph's new title. As St. Joseph had been the Protector of Jesus and Mary during their perils on earth, so now from Heaven St. Joseph would be invoked to be the Protector of the Catholic Church, the Household of Faith, as it faced the perils of an historically new situation, stripped as it was of the "Robe of Peter."

In 1912, Pope Pius X re-named this feast the "Solemnity of St. Joseph" and placed it on the Third Wednesday after Easter, with an Octave. Then, in 1955, Pope Pius XII transformed the Solemnity into the feast of St. Joseph the Workman to be celebrated on May 1st.




