

Pastor's Note

THE SUMMER TRIDUUM OF CHARITY: ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

The middle of July in the Old Calendar of the Roman Church

gives us a beautiful "Triduum of Charity" in three Saints who are outstanding in their heroic works of charity. They are St. Camillus de Lellis (July 18th), St. Vincent de Paul (July 19th), and St. Jerome Emiliani (July 20th). St. Camillus de Lellis is distinguished for his care for the poor sick, especially for victims of pestilence. He bound himself and his brethren by vow to come to the aid of the plague-stricken even at the risk of their own lives. The Venetian nobleman Jerome Emiliani expended his family fortune on providing care for orphaned children. St. Vincent de Paul, of humble peasant origins, found himself raised to the heights in the Kingdom of France in the middle of the 17th Century, so great was his renown as a missionary reformer priest and as an organizer of works of mercy for the poor. In modern times Pope Leo XIII declared St. Vincent de Paul to be the patron before God of all the charitable societies existing throughout the Catholic world.

The life and work of *Monsieur Vincent* (as he was called in his lifetime) offers both a stark and an instructive contrast to contemporary ideas about charitable good works. There was no strategic plan, no Foundation, no development office, no fund-raising arm, no galas. He was not seeking to "end poverty" (which, in the 17th Century, would not have been a realistic goal anyways). He was motivated in his prodigious charitable works by the love of Christ and by a great desire to serve Christ in the disguise of our neighbor who is poor and in distress.

O God [he used to say] it does us good to see the poor, if we look at them in the light of God, and think of the high esteem in which Jesus Christ

holds them. Often enough they have scarcely the appearance or the intelligence of reasonable beings, so rude and so earthly are they. But look at them by the light of faith, and you will see that they represent the Son of God who chose to be poor; He in His Passion had scarcely the appearance of a man; He seemed to the Gentiles to be a fool, and to the Jews as a stumbling block, moreover He calls Himself the evangelist of the poor: 'evangelizare pauperibus misit me.'

What is done for charity's sake is done for God. It is not enough for us that we love God ourselves; our neighbor also must love Him; neither can we love our neighbor as ourselves unless we procure for him the good we are bound to desire for ourselves—viz. divine love, which unites us to our Sovereign Good. We must love our neighbor as the image of God and the object of His love, and must try to make men love their Creator in return, and love one another with mutual charity for the love of God, who so loved them as to deliver His own Son to death for them. But let us, I beg of you, look upon the Divine Savior as a perfect pattern of the charity we must bear to our neighbor. (Dom Prosper Gueranger, O.S.B, <u>The</u> <u>Liturgical Year</u>, Vol. 13)

Let us therefore try to learn the ways of Christian charity more and more from this great hero of charity, St. Vincent de Paul.

All classes will be head in the Lower Church Hall. Children from Grades K-10.



And the steward said within himself: 'What shall I do, because my lord taketh away from me the stewardship? To dig I am not able: to beg I am ashamed. I know what I will do, that when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.' Therefore calling together every one of his master's debtors, he said to the first: 'How much dost thou owe my lord?' But he said: 'A hundred barrels of oil.' And he said to him: 'Take thy bill, and sit down quickly, and write fifty.' Then he said to another: 'And how much dost thou owe?' Who said: 'A hundred quarters of wheat.' He said to him: 'Take thy bill, and write eighty.' And the lord commended the unjust steward, for as much as he had done wisely: for the children of this world are wiser in their generation than the children of light. And I say unto you: Make unto yourselves friends of the mammon of iniquity, that when you fail, they may receive you into everlasting dwellings."
