Pastor's Note



Fr. Higgins SECOND COLLECTION FOR FATHER SALAKO'S MISSIONS

Coday we appeal to your generosity on behalf of the missions supported by Fr.

Desiré Salako, S.M.A., Provincial Superior for Benin/Niger. West Africa. I share with you the recent e-mail I have received from Fr. Salako together with some pictures.

Dear Father Higgins:

I bring you greetings of peace and love in the name of Our Lord Jesus Christ in whom we live and move and have our being! It is with a heavy heart that I write to you once again because the present pandemic has made it again impossible for me to be with you physically this summer, but I know I am united with you in spirit and in prayer.

Despite the pandemic we were able to continue the work in the seminary. The seminary had a dormitory, which has been transformed into single rooms because of the risk of the virus transmission, and also for individual privacy.

The training of the girl child-mother continues. Many students here have benefited from your generous contributions, which has enabled them to continue their education. We dug wells in three different places. Thanks to your support, we have been able to achieve so much. May the Lord in His goodness reward and keep you in His love.

For this year we plan and hope to build a dormitory for girl child-mothers because we feel it is risky for them to be together in a single room. With local contribution, we have raised the sum of \$4,000. The rooms will cost us about \$30,000. There is also the need of getting solar electricity for the sewing machines in the Women's Center—because there is no electricity in the area for that, we would need a sum of \$15,000. We would also like to continue to support the less privileged in our society. For this, we would need \$1,500 as school fees for 8 students.

I will continuously remain grateful to you all for your generosity to our mission here in Benin, in Niger and in Liberia. On behalf of all the beneficiaries, the seminarians and myself, I am saying thank you for your financial support and prayers. May God bless and reward you!



LATIN MASS PROPERS: FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 83. 10, 11 BEHOLD, O God, our protector, and look on the face of Thy Christ: for better is one day in Thy courts above thousands. *Ps. ibid.* 2. How lovely are Thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts! my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Behold, O God ...

COLLECT FAVOR Thy Church unceasingly, O Lord, we beseech Thee, and keep her safe: and because apart from Thee frail man is wont to fall, may she by Thy help be ever withdrawn from harm and guided in good. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Galatians, 5. 16-24. BRETHREN: Walk in the spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lusts of the flesh: for the flesh lusteth against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh; for these are contrary one to another; so that you do not the things that you would. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest; which are fornication, uncleanness, immodesty, luxury, idolatry, witchcrafts, enmities, contentions, emulations, wraths, quarrels, dissensions, sects, envies, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like; of the which I foretell you, as I have foretold to you, that they who do such things shall not obtain the Kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is, charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity. Against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified their flesh with the vices and concupiscences.

GRADUAL: Psalm 117. 8-9. IT is good to confide in the Lord, rather than to have confidence in man. It is good to trust in the Lord, rather than to trust in princes. ALLELUIA: Psalm 94. 1. Alleluia, alleluia. Come, let Come, let us praise the Lord with joy; let us joyfully sing to God our Savior. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, 6. 24-33. AT THAT TIME, Jesus said to His disciples: No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you, be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are you not of much more value than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin; but I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. Now if God so clothe the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous therefore saying: What shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? for after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the Kingdom of God, and His justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.


