# **Pastor's Note**

## BLESSING OF SEED AND SEEDLINGS

September 1st in the *Ordo* of Catholic liturgical worship now contains the special designation: *World Day of* 

*Prayer for the Care of Creation*. The Pope's Intention for this Month of September, 2021 is: *For a Sustainable Environment*. As we know there is a general heightened (we might even say *hyper*) awareness of care for the earth's natural environment in our world today.

For Christians, it is important for us to keep our environmentalism Christian, if you will. There is a great deal of eco-apocalypticism, pantheism, neo-paganism, and materialism in care-for-theenvironment discourse. We want to separate ourselves from that.

A Christian environmentalism focuses on man's rôle of good steward of God's creation, as we read in Genesis 2:15: *"The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to till and to keep it."* This is a metaphor for the whole of humankind's development of the earth's resources to sustain life and improve the conditions of life.

A Christian environmentalism also acknowledges God's sovereignty over His Creation. We rely on His Providence for the earth's continued ability to sustain life. One way to read the Old Testament Books of the Bible is to read them from the point of view of how people are trying to make theological sense out of the larger forces of nature over which they have no control and which can so easily wipe them out. Compare the most dire weather reports and predictions from today's news stories on human-caused climate change to the actual extreme-climate events being suffered by people in the Bible. They seem very similar! In the Bible, as the sacred texts of the People of Israel, they are interpreted in terms of the people's fidelity or infidelity to the LORD God.

A secular world's narrative still blames humanity for collective sin, only it is the Planet Earth which is punishing us in the place of an offended Deity.

A Christian corrective would focus on humble prayer to God for His mercy in continuing to give to the earth the good things which are necessary for life. An example of this is the beautiful blessing-prayer for seeds and seedlings given on the Feast of Our Lady's Nativity, September 8th. I reproduce that text from the old Roman Ritual here:

### BLESSING OF SEED AND SEEDLINGS On the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

*O holy Lord, Father Almighty, everlasting God,* we beg Thee to look with friendly countenance and benevolent eyes upon these seeds and seedlings. As Thou didst proclaim to Moses, Thy servant in the land of Egypt, saying: "Tell the children of Israel that when they enter the land of promise which I shall give them, they are to offer the first-fruits to the priests, and they shall be blessed"; so too at our request, O Lord, bless these seeds in Thy benevolence, and let them germinate and grow. Let neither hail nor frost destroy them, but keep them unharmed unto a finest maturity and abundant harvest for the service of body and soul, Thou who livest and reignest in perfect Trinity forever. Amen.

O Almighty, everlasting God, Sower and Tiller of the heavenly world, Who dost cultivate the field of our hearts with heavenly tools, hearken to our prayers, and pour forth bountiful blessings upon the fields in which these seeds will be sown. By Thy protecting hand, turn away the fury of the elements, so that this entire fruit may be filled with Thy blessing, and may be gathered without hindrance into the granary. Through Our Lord, Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in unity of the Holy Ghost, God, forevermore. Amen.

As I did with the Blessing of Plants and Flowers for the Assumption this year, I would like to offer also this Blessing of Seeds and Seedlings next Saturday, September 11th, at 9 AM, immediately before the Mass. I invite anyone





# LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**INTROIT:** Psalm 85. 1, 2, 3. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.


