

PARISH ANNUAL REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021

Chis Sunday I am presenting to you the Annual Report on the finances of the Parish Church

and Parish Cemetery for the last Fiscal Year 2021 which ended on June 30th.

I am happy to be able to report to you that our balance sheet looks very good this year. On the Church side we see a positive bottom line of **\$14,988.00**. On the Cemetery side we see a small loss of **\$1,528.00**. This was due to an unplanned but necessary expense to remove excess soil from one section.

In spite of the strong head-winds against us (continuing surges of COVID-19, severe state-ofemergency restrictions on occupancy, keeping the church doors open in all weather with the heat blasting) we came through in surprisingly good financial shape. This was due to the continued support which you, the lay faithful of this parish, gave to our church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes during this time, and gave generously and sacrificially. We have benefited from more people using the on-line giving option and also from the spontaneous generosity of people who have sent in unsolicited donations to be used "where it's needed most". As you can see also from the balance sheet, we were doing our best to watch expenses. This year we came in \$65,000.00 under in budgeted expenses.

To sum it up: in the midst of a terrible year, there were a lot of things that broke our way. For this we ought to be especially grateful to God.

One takeaway from this year's report I think is that it shows that the parish can indeed be supported (as it should be) by the collective gifts of the faithful for their church support. We do indeed have a viable parish, if people remain committed to their stewardship-level giving and stable commitment to parish membership.

As your Pastor I can only say to you: *Thank you!* Thank you for all the sacrifices you have made (and are still making) for this parish. Thank you for all your steadfastness and your faithful witness in the midst of these long months of the pandemic. In the words the LORD God commanded Moses to be said over the people of Israel: *The LORD bless you and keep you. The LORD make His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you: The LORD lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace.* (*Numbers 6*).

We have received a very generous legacy over the past year from the will of the late +**Richard Campana** for the support of St. Mary's Cemetery. We are most grateful to our benefactor and deeply moved at his desire to see that our Catholic parish cemetery continue to have the means for proper upkeep and care. I intend to have Mr. Campana remembered at a monthly Mass for the next year beginning next month, November—the Month of Remembrance for the dead.

Photocopies of this year's Annual Report for the Church and Cemetery are available to you in the pamphlet rack of the front vestibule of the church. I encourage you to take them.

Let us ever thank God for all of His many gifts and benefits.

And let us renew our own resolution to always try to "do our part" and be evermindful of our human duty by others.

An informational sheet put out by the Massachusetts Catholic Conference is available to you at the entrance tables to the main church and also in the front vestibule pamphlet rack with regard to two identical bills in the Massachusetts State House which will be taken up this session.

These bills, "An Act relative to end of life options", are (in the words of the Catholic Bishops of Massachusetts' statement), "An affront to life and a dangerous precedent for determining end of life issues. Physicians are

trained to care for the ill, not to hasten death."

We are urged to exercise our civic duty as constituents and contact our legislators to urge them to vote *NO* on House Bill 2381 and Senate Bill 1384. Information on how to contact your local legislators is provided on this sheet.
