

THE CONSUMMATION OF ALL THINGS

Swiftly now the Church's Year of Grace moves towards its finale by pointing us to our Last End and the Consummation of

All Things in Christ.

We may see this represented in a chain of four special observances over the next two weeks. This Sunday we observe **World Mission Sunday** which places before our eyes the ongoing action of Christ's "Great Commission", as we read it in the conclusion of St. Matthew's Gospel:

And the eleven disciples went into Galilee, unto the mountain where Jesus had appointed them. And seeing Him they adored: but some doubted. And Jesus, coming, spoke to them saying: All power is given to Me in heaven and on earth. Going therefore, teach ye all nations: baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you. And behold I am with you all days, even unto the close of the age. (Matthew 28:16-20)

Next Sunday, October 31st, the Vigil of All Saints (All Hallows' E'en or "Halloween") coincides with the Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, which feast highlights Christ's sovereignty over the world. As one Missal note explains it"

The whole of today's Mass and Office are a solemn assertion of the universal royalty of Christ against the great heresy of our days which is secularism. Occurring as it does on the last Sunday of October, towards the end of the liturgical year and just before the Feast of All Saints, the feast of the Kingship of Christ appears as the crowning glory of all the mysteries of the life of Christ and as an anticipation in time of the eternal royalty



which He exercises over all the elect in the glory of heaven. The great reality of Christianity is the Risen Christ reigning in the glory of His victory among the elect who are the fruit of His triumph. (St. Andrew's Missal, 1961 edition)

(N. B. In the Pauline Reform, the Feast of the Kingship of Christ is moved to the very last Sunday of the Year, just before the First Sunday of Advent.)




Monday, November 1st, is the Feast of All Saints, the celebration of the whole of the Church Triumphant in Heaven. Immediately the next day, November 2nd, All Souls' Day, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, the Church on earth offers all her

prayers and suffrages for the saved souls who are undergoing their purgatory before entering Heaven. It is the day also when, with deep emotion, we remember our own beloved dead, that they may be freed from their sins and enjoy forever the Beatific Vision of God.



LATIN MASS PROPERS: THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: Psalm 129: 3-4 If Thou shalt observe iniquities, O Lord, Lord, who shall endure it? for with Thee is propitiation, O God of Israel. Psalm 129: 1-2 From the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice. V. Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God, our refuge and strength, who art the author of all godliness; hear, we pray Thee, the devout prayers of Thy Church, and grant that what we ask confidently we may obtain effectually. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: Philippians I: 6-II Brethren, we are confident in the Lord Jesus, that He who hath begun a good work in you, will perfect it unto the day of Christ Jesus. As it is meet for me to think this for you all, for that I have you in my heart; and that, in my bands and in the defense and confirmation of the Gospel, you are all partakers of my joy. For God is my witness, how I long after you all in the depths of Jesus Christ. And this I pray, that your charity may more and more abound in knowledge and in all understanding; that you may approve the better things; that you may be sincere and without offense unto the day of Christ; filled with the fruit of justice, through Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

GRADUAL: Psalm 132: 1-2 Behold how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity. *V.* It is like the precious ointment on the head, that ran down upon the beard, the beard of Aaron. ALLELUIA: Psalm 113: 11 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* They that fear the Lord, let them hope in Him; He is their helper and protector. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Matthew 22: 15-21 **A**t that time, the Pharisees went and consulted among themselves, how to ensnare Jesus in His speech. And they sent to Him their disciples, with the Herodians, saying: Master, we know that Thou art a true speaker, and teachest the way of God in truth, neither carest Thou for any man, for Thou dost not regard the person of men. Tell us therefore, what dost Thou think? Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not? But Jesus knowing their wickedness, said: Why do you tempt Me, ye hypocrites? Show me the coin of the tribute. And they offered Him a penny. And Jesus saith to them: Whose image and superscription is this? They say to Him: Caesar's. Then He saith to them: Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's; and to God the things that are God's.

LET YOUR VOICE BE HEARD! Say NO to Physician Assisted Suicide in Massachusetts

An informational sheet put out by the Massachusetts Catholic Conference is available to you at the entrance tables to the main church and also in the front vestibule pamphlet rack with regard to two identical bills in the Massachusetts State House which will be taken up this session. These bills, "An Act relative to end of life options", are (in the words of the Catholic

Bishops of Massachusetts' statement), "An affront to life and a dangerous precedent for determining end of life issues. Physicians are trained to care for the ill, not to hasten death."

We are urged to exercise our civic duty as constituents and contact our legislators to urge them to vote NO on House Bill 2381 and Senate Bill 1384. Information on how to contact your local legislators is provided on this sheet.


