

Pastor's Note



Fr. Higgins ETERNAL LIFE OR "DEATHLESSNESS"?

Living as we do at a time of technological innovation it is not surprising that we should find people who are obsessed

with finding a technological "fix" for human mortality. Apparently in the new field of biology known as parabiosis there are experiments being done to give older people blood transfusions from younger people to see if it has any effect on the ageing process.

Even if it were possible, however, to reverse the ageing process and extend the human life span indefinitely, such a breakthrough would not come close to giving us the Eternal Life of Christian promise. Instead, it would be tantamount to "deathlessness". Life would go on and on, with all of its pain and problems, and people would soon be yearning again for the release of death.

It is very important, therefore, that we have a clear-eyed understanding of what death is in the light of Christian Revelation.

Let us review the important points here:

- "Death" so-called really means bodily death. Our souls are directly created immortal by God and therefore no-one can ever really die.
- Death was not part of God's original design. It entered the world as a result of sin. As we read, for example, in the Book of Wisdom: *"For God created man incorruptible, and to the image of His own likeness He made him. But, by the envy of the Devil, death came into the world: And they follow him that are of his side" (Wisdom 2:23-25). Death, therefore, has a penal character. It is the universal price every human being has to pay for Adam's sin. It is <i>"the debt to which every man is subject" (Recommendation of the Departing Soul).*

- Jesus Christ Our Lord, by dying an atoning death on the Cross and then on the Third Day rising from the dead by His own divine power, has transformed the experience of death from being merely the penalty for sin to becoming, instead, the gate to a higher and permanent life. Death is the gateway to Eternal Life. In order to live forever in Heaven, one has to die.
- Our Christian faith life on earth involves a continuous process of death and resurrection as preparation for the definitive actual experience of them. For example, we have to learn in so many ways to "die" to the egocentric self in order to be free to "live" for God. The selfish ego has to give way to "Christ living in us". And the beauty of it is that by dying-to-self, Jesus gives us our true self. It is one of the central paradoxes of Christianity: one has to die in order to live.
- However much progress a soul has made in dying to the "old Adam" so as to live for Christ in true freedom, the sinful wound of the "old Adam" cannot be completely cured until we have experienced bodily death and our soul is rent from our body.
- Therefore, a Christian should be evermindful of the all-important hour of his death, for with death it is no longer possible for us to change. Our will is fixed, for God or against God.
- In addition we should seek to have a higher view of our life on earth while it lasts, as it is said of St. Martin of Tours (+A.D. 397): "He was neither afraid to die, nor unwilling to live."
- Finally we should both seek to train our minds and ask for the special grace not to be afraid when we perceive that the Hour of Death is making its approach to us. St. Francis of Assisi spoke in grateful terms of "Sister Death", as he concluded his Canticle of the Sun: "Praised by my Lord for our sister, the death of the body, from which no man can escapeth...Blessed are those who die in Thy most holy will, for the second death shall have no power to do them harm. Praise ye, and bless the Lord, and give thanks to Him and serve Him with great humility.


