# **Pastor's Note**



### Fr. Higgins THE PRAYER OF THE ANGELUS AFTER THE SUNDAY LATIN MASS

**A**s a follow-up to last Sunday's Pastor's Note on Pope Paul VI's exhortation to Catholics to pray

the Angelus three times each day (morningnoon-and-evening) I want to lay out the Latin text of the Angelus Prayer which we chant congregationally each Sunday at the end of the 11 AM and 5:30 PM Latin Masses.





### LATIN MASS PROPERS: TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

**INTROIT:** Jeremias 29. 11, 12, 14; Psalm 84. 2 The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Ps.* 84. 2. Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob.  $\tilde{V}$ . Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — The Lord ...

**COLLECT** O Lord, we beseech Thee, absolve Thy people from their offenses, that through Thy bountiful goodness, we may be freed from the bonds of those sins, which by frailty we have committed. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

**EPISTLE:** From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Philippians, 3. 17-21; 4. 1-3. Brethren: Be ye followers of me, and observe them who walk so as you have our model. For many walk, of whom I have told you often (and now tell you weeping), that they are enemies of the cross of Christ; whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame; who mind earthly things. But our conversation is in heaven, from whence also we look for the Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ, who will reform the body of our lowness, made like to the body of His glory, according to the operation whereby also He is able to subdue all things unto Himself. 
