





COLLECT: STIR up Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: that from the threatening dangers of our sins, we may deserve to be rescued by Thy protection, and be saved by Thy deliverance: Who livest and reignest with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Romans, 13. 11-14 BRETHREN, knowing that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep. For now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. 
