HOMAGE TO POPE BENEDICT XVI

The death and burial of Pope Benedict XVI, who lived on as "Pope Emeritus" for nearly ten

years after the end of his Papacy, stirred up a great deal of emotion in me. Count me among the millions of Catholic believers who saw in him a true "Pastor Bonus" (a "Good Shepherd") and a worthy executor of the Petrine Office.

It is disgusting—and that is not too strong a word—the scorn and the slander directed at his memory by the media pile-on. In the media-universe Pope Francis is progressive and trying to move the Catholic Church in the right direction, therefore the late Pope Benedict must be cast as his arch-nemesis, the embodiment of reactionary thinking and of all that is (and everwas) bad in the Church.

I cannot say that I am surprised to see Pope Benedict XVI so vilified and the record of his Papacy so misrepresented by the media. It is true to form. Nevertheless, it is galling to see it playing out as it is.

Pope Benedict died on the feast-day of Pope St. Sylvester, December 31st (the Seventh Day of Christmas). Pope St. Sylvester was the reigning Pope at the time of the "Peace of the Church" when the Roman Emperor Constantine first tolerated (313 A.D.), then embraced, Christianity. Sylvester's was a peaceful

Pontificate after three-hundred years of bloody persecution. Brief as this Peace of the Church was in terms of years it nevertheless foreshadows the Peace of the Church in the Heavenly Kingdom. St. Sylvester stands around the Crib of Christ as, to quote Dom Prosper Gueranger, "the messenger of Peace which Christ came to give the world, of which the Angels sang on Christmas Night."

I experienced Pope Benedict XVI's eight-year Pontificate as a time of peace in the church like that of Pope St. Sylvester's. During his reign we had a gentle-mannered Pope who knew how to conduct himself with a sense of the dignity of state

St. Sylvester's confirmation of the decrees of the Council of Nicea (325 A.D.) on the eternal divinity of Christ (What we affirm each time we recite the Nicene Creed) did much to strengthen the orthodox position against Arianism. So also, Benedict was a clear teacher of Catholic doctrine and its faithful guardian. During his years as Pope it was commented upon how well attended his public Catecheses were in St. Peter's Square and how attentive the crowds were to his words.

Pope Sylvester presided over the consecration of the first churches for public worship in Rome. He also did much to set up the order and beauty of divine worship. Pope Benedict XVI oversaw a veritable renaissance in the beautiful celebration of the Roman liturgy. His generous solution for the continued celebrated of the Traditional Roman Rite alongside the reformed Rites promulgated by Paul VI was a part of this enhancement of divine worship across the board.

There are many good parallels we can draw between Pope St. Sylvester and Pope Benedict XVI. It is not too much to say that perhaps God was giving us a sign of Heaven's blessing on Pope Benedict's reign by having him born to Heaven on Sylvester Mass?

On the 18th Day of May will be the Ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ.


On the 28th Day of May, the Feast of Pentecost.


