TEN SUNDAYS TO EASTER

This Sunday we begin the traditional Easter Cycle of the Church's Year of Grace with the observance of Septuagesima

Sunday. Ten Sundays from today we will be celebrating Easter, April 9th, 2023.
Septuagesima, the Latin word for "Seventieth" draws us back in to the history of Israel in the Old Testament. After the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple of Solomon, many of the survivors were carried off into slavery in Babylon (present-day Iraq). After seventy years of this Babylonian Captivity, the Jews were allowed to return and re-build their capital city, including their Temple.

The Church makes use of this imagery in the Lenten renewal. The faithful are invited to place themselves spiritually in the state of unredemption, likening their state to the captives of old. Their seventy-year captivity is re-purposed into the Christian's seventy-day spiritual journey to Easter, a journey which begins with three Sundays of Pre-Lent (Septuagesima), then intensifies with Ash Wednesday and the Forty Days of Lent proper, and culminates in the Sacred Triduum on Easter Eve, the celebration of the Paschal Mystery.

Septuagesima is the window of opportunity to prepare ourselves to make a good Lent.



Review the relevant Church laws regarding fast and abstinence and then decide on a personal program for Lenten observance: How am I going to practice prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during the Forty Days?

As we have in past years, we will have a Parish Lenten Mission incorporated into the *Via Crucis*, the Stations of the Cross, on Friday nights during Lent. The theme of this Year's Mission will be: "Frere André Bessette, the 'Miracle Man of Montreal'."



Vineyard, by Dutch painter Salomon Koninck (1647-1649). This scene is taken from the end of the Gospel Parable Matthew 20:1-16, which is the Gospel Lesson for Septuagesima Sunday. At the end of the work-day the Vineyard owner pays every man the same wage, even though some came only at the last hour (the "eleventh hour"). The workers who labored the whole day are disgruntled by this generosity of the proprietor to these last. He says to them: "Friend, I do thee no wrong. Didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what is thine and go thy way. Or is it not lawful for me to do what I will? Is thy eye evil, because I am good?" (Matt. 20:13b-15). The sense of the Parable is that God is the Vineyard owner, the Vineyard is the world, the workers are those who labor for the Kingdom. The "penny", the daily wage is the reward of eternal life. God gives it freely, even to those who turned to Him only at the end of their lives.

birthday.

<u>Days of Penance</u>
Applies to all the Faithful.
Lent and Fridays outside of
Lent.

Days of Fast
Everyone aged 18-59.
1 full meal permitted, two
other meals may be taken
which, when combined, are
less than a full meal.
Ash Wednesday and Good
Friday.

(The obligation to do penance is lifted on Fridays which are also celebrated as a solemnity: e.g., Christmas Day).

OLDER DISCIPLINE

Days of Abstinence

Applies on one's 7th

birthday.

Complete Abstinence on all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, and the Vigil of Christmas.

Partial Abstinence (meat and soup, or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at principal meal) weekdays of Lent, Ember Days of Wednesday & Saturday, Vigils of Pentecost & Assumption. (Abstinence dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation.)

Days of Fast
Everyone aged 21-59.
Days of Lent from Ash

LATIN MASS PROPERS: SEPTUAGESIMA SUNDAY

INTROIT: Ps. 17. 5, 6, 7 The sorrows of death surrounded me, the of hell encompassed me: and in my affliction I called upon the Lord, and He heard my voice from His holy Temple *Psalm 17. 2-3* I will love Thee, O Lord, my strength: the Lord is my firmament, my refuge, and my deliverer. *V. G*lory be to the Father. COLLECT Graciously hear, we beseech Thee, O Lord, the prayers of Thy people, that we who are justly afflicted for our sins, may be mercifully delivered by Thy goodness for the glory of Thy name. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: I Corinthians 9. 24-27; 10. 1-5 Brethren: Know you not that they that run in the race, all run indeed, but one receiveth the prize? So run that you may obtain. And every one that striveth for the mastery refraineth himself from all things: and they indeed that they may receive a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible one. I therefore so run, not as at an uncertainty; I so fight, not as one beating the air: but I chastise my body, and bring it into subjection, lest perhaps when I have preached to others, I myself should become a castaway. For I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all in Moses were baptized, in the cloud and in the sea: and all did eat the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink: (and they drank of the spiritual rock that followed them: and the rock was Christ). But with most of them God was not well pleased.

GRADUAL: Psalm 9. 10-11, 19-20 A helper in due time in tribulation: let them trust in Thee who know Thee: for Thou hast not forsaken them that seek Thee, O Lord. *V*. For the poor man shall not be forgotten to the end: the patience of the poor shall not perish forever: arise, O Lord, let no man prevail. TRACT: Psalm 129. 1-4 Out of the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice *V*. Let Thine ears be attentive to the prayer of Thy servant. *V*. If Thou, O Lord, wilt mark iniquities: O Lord: O Lord, who shall abide it? *V*. For with Thee there is merciful forgiveness, and by reason of Thy law I have waited for Thee, O Lord.

GOSPEL: Matthew 20. 1-16 At that time Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is like to a householder who went out early in the morning to hire labourers into His vineyard. And having agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And going out about the third hour, he saw others standing in the market place idle, and he said to them: Go you also into my vineyard, and I will give you what shall be just. And they went their way. And again he went out about the sixth and the ninth hour: and did in like manner. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing, and he saith to them: Why stand you here all the day idle? They say to him: Because no man hath hired us. He saith to them: Go you also into my vineyard. And when evening was come, the lord of the vineyard saith to his steward: Call the labourers and pay them their hire, beginning from the last even to the first. When therefore they were come that came about the eleventh hour, they received every man a penny. But when the first also came, they thought that they should receive more: and they also received every man a penny. And receiving it they murmured against the master of the house, saying: These last have worked but one hour, and thou hast made them equal to us that have borne the burden of the day and the heats. But he answering said to one of them: Friend, I do thee no wrong: didst thou not agree with me for a penny? Take what it is thine and go thy way: I will also give to this last even as to thee. Or is it not lawful for me to do what I will? Is thy eye evil, because I am good? So shall the last be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few chosen.


