ROGATIONTIDE

The "Great Forty Days" commemorating Christ's visible presence among His disciples after His Resurrection (from

Easter to Ascension) are drawing to a close. Thursday of this week is Ascension Thursday. [See the Mass Schedule for the Ascension on the opposite page.] Traditionally the three days before the Ascension of the Lord are observed as Rogation Days, with public processions of penance and the Mass of Rogation. To distinguish these Rogations Days from the St. Mark's Procession of April 25th, they are also called the "Lesser Litanies".

The Procession consists of the chanting of the Litany of the Saints and prayers of petition. Their object is a prayer for mercy—to call God's mercy down upon the earth that we may be spared the consequences of strict divine justice, and that the earth may be fruitful for this year's harvest.

We will hold two such Rogation Processions this year, Monday and Wednesday, at 12:30 PM. At the conclusion of the Procession, the priest will celebrate the Mass of Rogation. If you cannot attend these Processions, it would be a wonderful practice to recite the Litany of the Saints privately in union with the spirit of Rogationtide. Also, alternatively, one could offer 5 decades of the Rosary for this intention.

LATIN MASS PROPERS: FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

INTROIT: Isaias 48. 2; Ps. 65. 1-2 Declare it with the voice of joy, and make this to be heard, alleluia: speak it out even to the ends of the earth: The Lord hath delivered His people, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His Name: give glory to His praise. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

COLLECT: O God, from whom all good things do come, grant to us Thy suppliants, that by Thine inspiration we may think what is right, and under Thy guidance perform it. Through our Lord Jesus Christ ...

EPISTLE: From the Epistle of Blessed James the Apostle (James 1. 22-27) Dearly beloved, be ye doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. For if a man be a hearer of the word and not a doer, he shall be compared to a man beholding his own countenance in a glass: for he beheld himself and went his way, and presently forgot what manner of man he was. But he that hath looked into the perfect law of liberty and hath continued therein, not becoming a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work: this man shall be blessed in his deed. And if any man think himself to be religious, not bridling his tongue but deceiving his own heart, this man's religion is vain. Religion clean and undefiled before God and the Father is this: To visit the fatherless and widows in their tribulation, and to keep one's self unspotted from this world.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: John 16. 28 Alleluia, alleluia. Christ is risen, and hath shone upon us, whom He redeemed with His Blood. Alleluia. (*John 16. 28.*) I came forth from the Father, and am come into the world: again I leave the world and I go to the Father. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. John 16. 23-30 **At** that time Jesus said to His disciples: Amen, amen, I say to you: If you ask the Father any thing in My Name, He will give it to you. Hitherto you have not asked any thing in My Name: Ask, and you shall receive, that your joy may be full. These things I have spoken to you in proverbs. The hour cometh when I will no more speak to you in proverbs, but will show you plainly of the Father. In that day you shall ask in My Name: and I say not to you that I will ask the Father for you: for the Father Himself loveth you, because you have loved Me and have believed that I came out from God. I came forth from the Father and am come into the world; again I leave the world and I go to the Father. His disciples say to Him: Behold, now Thou speakest plainly and speakest no proverb. Now we know that Thou knowest all things and Thou needest not that any man should ask Thee: by this we believe that Thou camest forth from God.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 65. 8-9, 20 O bless the Lord our God, ye peoples, and make the voice of His praise to be heard: who hath set my soul to live, and hath not suffered my feet to be moved. Blessed be the Lord, who hath not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me, alleluia.

SECRET: Accept, O Lord, the prayers of Thy faithful, together with the gifts they offer: that by these rites of loving devotion we may enter into heavenly Glory. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: Psalm 95. 2 Sing unto the Lord, alleluia; sing unto the Lord, and bless His Name; show forth His salvation from day to day, alleluia, alleluia.

POSTCOMMUNION: Grant to us, O Lord, who are filled with strength from this heavenly Table, that we may both desire what is right, and obtain what we desire. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son: Who with Thee liveth and reigneth in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

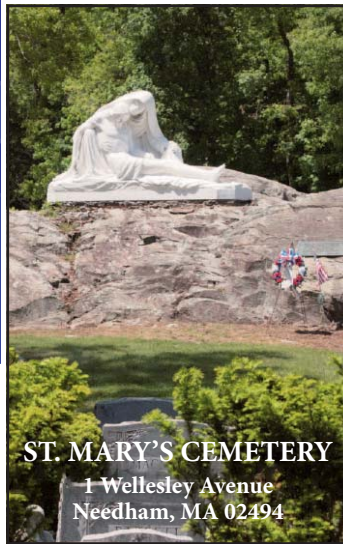

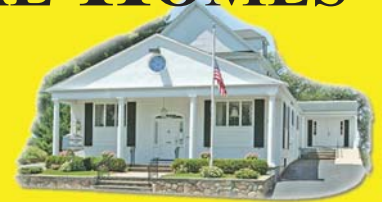

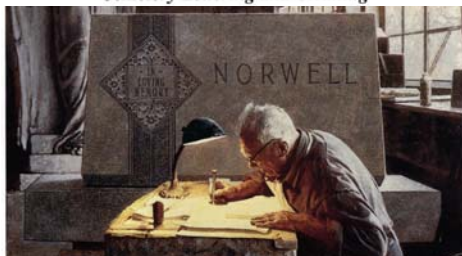
