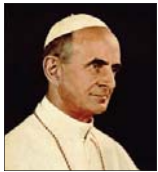

THE APPARITIONS OF OUR LADY MARY IMMACULATE AT LOURDES: 17 +1 THE EIGHTEENTH AND LAST APPARITION TO BERNADETTE, JULY 16th, 1858

When the diocesan commission began its investigation of the alleged apparitions at Lourdes they thought they were considering a complete sequence of 17 Apparitions between Shrove Thursday and Easter Wednesday, 1858. It was only later on that they learned of an 18th Apparition, which occurred on July 16th, 1858, the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Bernadette declared that she had not disclosed it previously because she considered this final Apparition distinct from all the ones which had preceded it and took it as one meant for her alone.

Nonetheless, we now have the record of this Carmelite Apparition included in our story of Notre Dame de Lourdes. After the Seventeenth Apparition and the "Miracle of the Candle" (Bernadette's fingers were not burned by the candle flame enveloping them while she was in ecstasy), the fame of Lourdes spread throughout the kingdom. We would recognize it as an early-kind of "media event". Curiosity seekers flooded Lourdes in the hope of seeing

the "one", Bernadette herself. The public authorities had barricaded the grotto at Massabielle up. They were fearful that a religious manifestation with large crowds of people might easily turn into political protests and disorder.

On the evening of Friday, July 16th, 1858, Bernadette was in church:

Now while she was praying, the voice of the "All Beautiful", after more than three months' silence, made itself heard again in her heart. Quick, quick, she had to go to the grotto: she was expected there!

Bernadette went with her aunt and some other women to the meadow on the opposite side of the river from the boarded-up Massabielle. From there Bernadette saw the Lady again.

'She appeared to me in the usual place, but did not say anything to me,' Bernadette declared later. 'Never had I seen her so beautiful.'

When Bernadette was asked how she could have seen her from such a distance as the river was so wide at that point and the planks of the police barrier came up so high, she replied.

At that moment I saw neither the [River] Gave nor the planks. It seemed to me that the distance between the Lady and myself was no greater than at other times. I saw only her.

Such was the last Apparition. There were no more to follow. As Bernadette herself concluded: *"Since then I have not seen her anymore."*

The Pope, a fan of her novels, noted her name. The resultant 1971 Indult for England & Wales for the Latin Mass to continue was dubbed thereafter "The Agatha Christie Indult.")

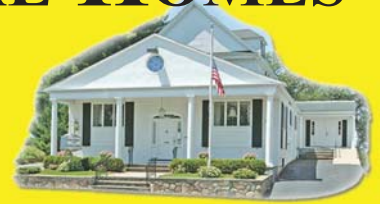

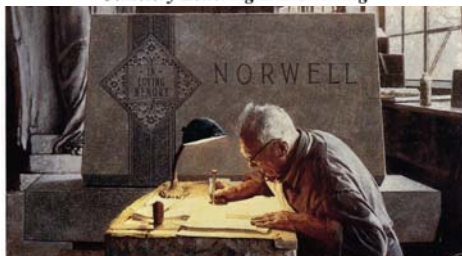
