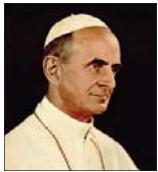

OUR LADY OF RANSOM

September 24th is the Feast Day of Our Lady of Ransom (also known as “Our Lady of Mercy”). This Feast of Our Lady

brings us back to an historic period of the Church’s life (12th Century A.D.) when the human trafficking by Muslim pirates who raided Christian Europe for slaves was a terrible reality. Many people were captured at sea or in coastal raids and carried off into slavery in North Africa. Ransoms were demanded of their families back in Europe.

This state of affairs persisted into modern times. Our own newly independent nation’s first foreign war was the War of the Barbary Pirates in the early-1800s. The pirates were raiding U.S. ships in the Mediterranean Sea and taking Americans captive.

There were two Catholic Religious Orders established in the 13th Century to mitigate this scourge of slaving. The first was the Order of the Holy Trinity; the second was the Order of Mercy, which is the Order recalled in our Feast of September 24th. It was called the Royal, Military and Religious Order of Our Lady of Mercy for the ransom of captives. It was composed of priests/clerics and knights. The priests were charged with celebrating the Divine Office in the commanderies of the Order, while the knights guarded the coasts and undertook the dangerous task of ransoming Christian captives.

A vision of Our Lady—the same one, but separately to three individuals in Aragon (Spain), Peter Nolasco, a layman, King James of Aragon, Raymond Penyafort, a Dominican priest and the king’s Father Confessor, on the same night—was the divine inspiration for the Order. The King erected the work by his royal decree in 1218. The members bound themselves by a fourth additional vow to the evangelical

Counsels of Poverty, Chastity, and Obedience: namely, “*to remain, when necessary, as securities in the power of the heathens, in order to deliver Christians.*” In a word, they bound themselves by vow to become hostages.

The Church, in her liturgy, has amplified these concrete circumstances of the historical record to the mystical plane. The Christians carried off into captivity by pirates is an image of the human race, captured by Satan, in slavery to sin and facing eternal Hell. Christ Our Lord, however, pays our ransom to divine justice by dying for us on the Cross. Our Lady Mary’s prayers and merits assist the human race greatly in the application of this ransom to individual human souls for salvation. Here is a translation of the Collect prayer for the Mass of Our Lady of Ransom:

O God, by means of the most glorious Mother of Your Son, You were pleased to give new children to Your Church for the deliverance of Christ’s faithful from the power of the heathen; grant, we pray You, that we who love and honor her as the Foundress of so great a work may, by her merits and prayers, be ourselves delivered from the bondage of the Evil One: Through the same Christ Our Lord.

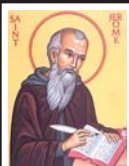

And the second is like to this: Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments dependeth the whole Law and the prophets. And the Pharisees being gathered together, Jesus asked them, saying: what think you of Christ, whose son is He? They say to Him: David's. He saith to them: How then doth David, in spirit, call Him Lord, saying: the Lord said to my Lord: Sit on my right hand until I make Thy enemies Thy footstool? If David then call Him Lord, how is He his son? And no man was able to answer Him a word; neither durst any man, from that day forth, ask Him any more questions.

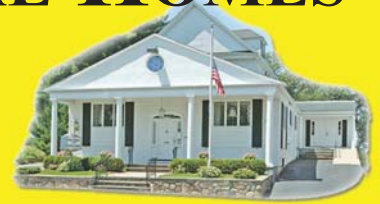

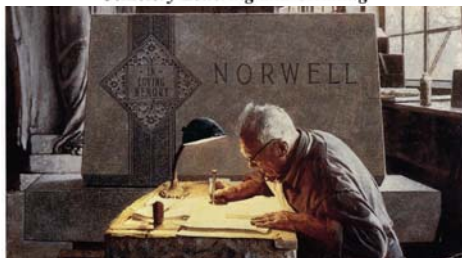
