Pastor's Note



Fr. Higgins THE BRIGITTINE/ CARMELITE ROSARY

Last Sunday's theme was the "Franciscan Crown" Rosary of the Seven Joys of Mary. Today I want to present another way of

saying the Rosary which is associated with St. Bridget of Sweden and St. Teresa of Avila, in her reform of the Carmelite Order.

The Brigittine/Carmelite Rosary is a six-decade Rosary (in contrast to the five-decade Dominican Rosary). St. Bridget of Sweden (+1373) received a great many privileged revelations from Our Lord, particularly in regard to the sufferings of His Passion. According to her understanding, the Blessed Mother lived 63 years upon the earth before her Assumption into Heaven. (This is in contrast to the Franciscan Crown tradition which holds that Mary's life-span was 72 years.) St. Bridget's Rosary has an extra decade, which, combined with the one Our Father and the three Hail Mary's before the decades begin, means a recitation of 7 Our Fathers in honor of the Seven Sorrows of Mary, and 63 Hail Mary's in honor of the supposed 63 years of her earthly life.

St. Teresa of Avila (+1582) became acquainted with the Brigittine Rosary when she enjoyed th hospitality of a Brigittine convent in her travels. In her Reform, she introduced the Brigittine Rosary to the Carmelites.



The Brigittine/Carmelite Rosary enters into the story of the Apparitions of Mary Immaculate at Lourdes in 1858. On March 25th, the beautiful lady appeared to Bernadette with the six-decade Rosary. On that day she finally gave Bernadette an answer to her question as to what was her name. She replied: *"I am the Immaculate Conception."* During the Apparition, as Bernadette finished praying her five-decade rosary, Mary Immaculate continued to pass the beads of her sixth decade silently. Mary is the New Eve, as Christ is the New Adam. In the Book of Genesis, Adam and Eve were created on the Sixth Day.

Moreover, the people of the Lourdes region were accustomed to praying the six-decade Rosary and so this detail of the Apparition was very conformable to their piety. Fittingly, in the large crowned statue of Notre Dame de Lourdes, Mary Immaculate is holding the six-decade Rosary.



In devotional terms, the simplest way of adopting this six-decade Rosary is to pray the usual five-decade Rosary with its Mysteries, and then dedicate the sixth decade to the Souls in Purgatory or to the Honor of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception.


