EASTER WEEK GREETINGS FROM FATHER SALAKO IN AFRICA

I received the following greetings and accompanying photographs from Fr. Desiré Salako, S.M.A. in Africa at the beginning of Easter Week, which I share with you:



Then, you will have to have the courage and the audacity to leave them. Finally, it is urgent to let ourselves be transformed by the Resurrection which is first and foremost a grace. Grace is there and it is first and moreover, we cannot progress in this virtue without the inspiration of grace. The Lord's Passover must not be in vain. His passage from death to life cannot not be of any use. It carries a message of liberation from the chains that bound us. It promises the beginning of a new advent.



Good morning, Dear Fr Higgins:

Happy Easter!

Life has flowed from the tomb! The Life in question can be compared to the Resurrection. It could have taken place in another place, up there, or in another space. The Life of God joined the body of Jesus in the tomb. Tomb, place of death, decay, corruption, darkness, etc. It was in the heart of the tomb that the flame of the Resurrection burst forth for Christ. So, for us, if we believe, it is in the heart of our night—night of fears, night of tears, night of betrayal, night of wounds, night of disappointment, night of diseases that the light of the Resurrection will spring forth. To do this, we will first have to accept our darkness.

We are continuing the achievements of the works to which you have contributed. These achievements comfort the hearts of our people.

Dear Parishioners, we will see each other again soon. Until then pray for us as we pray for you.

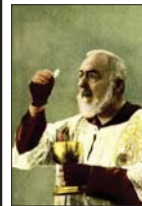

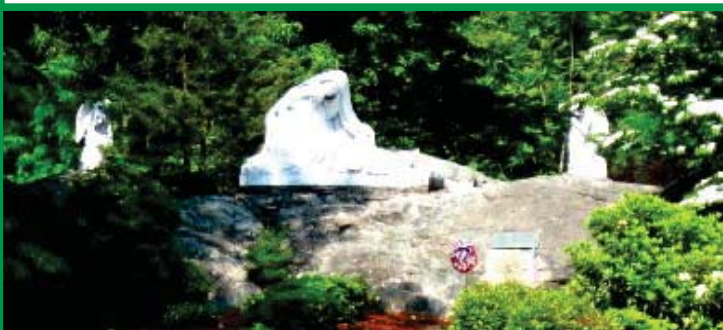

LATIN MASS PROPERS: GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY (2nd SUNDAY AFTER EASTER)

INTROIT: Psalm 32. 5-6, 1 The earth is full of the mercy of the Lord, alleluia: by the word of the Lord the heavens were established, alleluia, alleluia. *Ps. ibid. 1.* Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just; praise becometh the upright. *V.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. —The earth is full ...

COLLECT: O God, who, by the humility of Thy Son, didst lift up a fallen world, grant unending happiness to Thy faithful: that those whom Thou hast snatched from the perils of endless death, Thou mayest cause to Rejoice in everlasting joys. Through the same Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord...

EPISTLE: From First Epistle of Blessed Peter the Apostle (I Peter 2. 21-25) Dearly beloved: Christ suffered for us, leaving you an example, that you should follow His steps, who did no sin, neither was guile found in His mouth. Who when He was reviled, did not revile: when He suffered, He threatened not, but delivered Himself to him that judged Him unjustly: who His own self bore our sins in His body upon the tree: that we, being dead to sins, should live to justice; by whose stripes you were healed. For you were as sheep going astray: but you are now converted to the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.

PASCHAL ALLELUIA: Luke 24. 35; John 10. 14 Alleluia, alleluia. (*Lk. 24:35.*) The disciples knew the Lord Jesus in the breaking of bread. Alleluia. (*Jn. 10:14.*) I am the good Shepherd: and I know My sheep, and Mine know Me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. John 10. 11-16 At that time Jesus said to the Pharisees: I am the good Shepherd. The good Shepherd giveth His life for His sheep. But the hireling, and he that is not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming and leaveth the sheep and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth and scattereth the sheep: and the hireling fleeth, because he is a hireling and he hath no care for the sheep. I am the good Shepherd: and I know Mine, and Mine know Me. As the Father knoweth Me, and I know the Father: and I lay down My life for My sheep. And other sheep I have that are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear My voice, and there shall be one fold and one shepherd.
