

HOLY APOSTLES TIDE


Our celebration of Saints' Feasts for the Month of the Sacred Heart ends with the great feast of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul, June 29th, and its

traditional week-long celebration—Holy Apostles Tide. This feast overlaps and takes precedence over the last days of St. John the Baptist's Nativity, St. John's Tide.

The Roman Martyrology for their feast begins with the entry:

At Rome, the birthday of the holy apostles Peter and Paul, who suffered martyrdom on the same day, under Emperor Nero. Within the city the former (Peter) was crucified with his head downwards and buried in the Vatican, near the Triumphal Way, where he is venerated by the whole world. The latter (Paul) was put to the sword and buried on the Ostian Way, where he received similar honors ...

Peter by the cross, Paul by the sword: the two Prince of the Apostles completed their course by shedding their own life-blood with that of Christ. By the power of their prayers from Heaven they guide the Church Militant still.




LATIN MASS PROPERS: SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT: *Psalm 27: 8-9* The Lord is the strength of His people, and the protector of the salvation of His anointed: save, O Lord, Thy people, and bless Thy inheritance, and rule them for ever. *Psalm 27: 8-9* Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent to me, lest if Thou be silent to me, I become like them that go down into the pit. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT O God of all power and might, who art the giver of all good things; implant in our hearts the love of Thy name, increase in us true religion, nourish us with all goodness and by Thy mercy keep us in the same. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: *Romans 6: 3-11* Brethren, all we who are baptized in Christ Jesus are baptized in His death. For we are buried together with Him by baptism unto death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life. For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection. Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with Him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, and that we may serve sin no longer. For he that is dead is justified from sin. Now if ye be dead with Christ, we believe that we shall live also together with Christ. Knowing that Christ, rising again from the dead, dieth now no more, death shall no more have dominion over Him. For in that He died to sin He died once; but in that He liveth, He liveth unto God. So do you also reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin.

GRADUAL: *Psalm 89: 13, 1* Return, O Lord, a little; and be entreated in favour of Thy servants. *V.* Lord, Thou hast been our refuge from generation to generation. **ALLELUIA:** *Psalm 30: 2-3* Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped, let me never be confounded: deliver me in Thy justice, and release me; bow down Thy ear to me, make haste to deliver me. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mark 8: 1-9* **At** that time, when there was a great multitude with Jesus, and had nothing to eat, calling His disciples together, He saith to them: I have compassion on the multitude, for behold they have now been with Me three days, and have nothing to eat; and if I shall send them away fasting to their home, they will faint in the way: for some of them came from afar off. And His disciples answered Him: From whence can any one fill them here with bread in the wilderness? And He asked them: How many loaves have ye? Who said: Seven. And He commanded the people to sit down on the ground. And taking the seven loaves, giving thanks, He broke and gave to His disciples to set before the people. And they had a few little fishes, and He blessed them, and commanded them to be set before them. And they did eat, and were filled; and they took up that which was left of the fragments, seven baskets: and they that had eaten were about four thousand: and He sent them away.




