

Fr. Híggíns **CAREFUL SPEECH ABOUT THE HOLY EUCHARIST**

At a time when everyone is pressured to make sure to use careful speech about other

people's identity and beliefs, that is to say, using their preferred terms and avoiding using terms they deem demeaning or offensive, it is a curious thing that media outlets continue allow themselves to use inaccurate and offensive language when describing the Catholic belief in the Eucharist.

Such disregard was on full display during the news coverage for the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis (July 17th-21st). Here are some samples of the misuse of language, coming from a reputable main-stream news source, trying to describe the Eucharistic Adoration inside the Lucas Oil Stadium on Saturday, July 20th:

A four-foot, elaborate star-shaped gold vessel that contained the simple wafer that Catholic believe becomes the true presence of Jesus Christ ... Consuming the bread and wine

is the climax of every Mass ... Many at the congress referred to the vessel's contents not as "it" but as "him" ...

Does this kind of careless, offensive language about Catholic belief in the Eucharist betray an attitude that the writer can't believe they are having to write about such superstitious ridiculousness in this day-in-age? Clearly there is no attempt at all to understand Catholic Eucharistic belief on its own terms.

Reporters and commentators on Catholic religious life might turn, for example, to the Credo of the People of God, by Pope Paul VI (1968), which is now numbered among one of the official Professions of Faith of the Catholic Church. In Paragraph 24 we read:

We believe that the Mass, celebrated by the priest representing the Person of Christ by virtue of the power received through the Sacrament of Orders, and offered by him in the name of Christ and the members of His *Mystical Body, is in true reality the Sacrifice of* Calvary, rendered sacramentally present on our altars. We believe that as the bread and wine consecrated by the Lord at the Last Supper were changed into His Body and His Blood which were to be offered for us on the Cross, like wise the bread and wine consecrated

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by the priest are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ enthroned gloriously in Heaven, and we believe that the mysterious Presence of the Lord, under what continues to appear to our sense as before, is a true, real and substantial Presence.

There are terms and ways of speaking about the Eucharist we simply should not tolerate as Catholics. At the same time, we ourselves should be very careful about the language we use around the Holy Eucharist, never, ever referring to the consecrated Host as the "wafer", or talking about receiving Communion as merely "I took the bread".

How should we be talking carefully and respectfully about the Eucharist? May I suggest a list of proper terms. We could say: the Eucharist, the Holy Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion, the Host, the Chalice, the Body and Blood—always mindful of referring to Christ in the Eucharist in an elevated, respectful way.

We should also be attentive to good eucharistic etiquette in church. For example, taking the time to make a proper genuflection (and when we're before the monstrance during Eucharistic Adoration, making a double-genuflection and bowing the head), not yakking away inside the church so as to disturb the atmosphere of recollection. Interiorly, we should always remain aware and alert of when we are in the presence of the Presence.

The consistent respect we Catholics show about the Holy Eucharist is a very effective antidote to the cold sneer we find out and about in the culture.





Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE From the First Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 12. 2-11. BRETHREN, you know that, when you were heathens, you went to dumb idols, according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man, speaking by the Spirit of God, saith Anathema to Jesus; and no man can say: The Lord Jesus, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of graces, but the same Spirit; and there are diversities of operations, but the same God, who worketh all in all. And the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man unto profit. To one indeed, by the Spirit, is given the word of wisdom; and to another, the word of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another faith in the same Spirit; to another the grace of healing in one Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another, the discerning of spirits; to another, divers kinds of tongues; to another, interpretation of speeches.
