


₩ ewelcome back Father Desiré Salako, S.M.A., for his summer stay. Father Salako continues to serve as the Father Provincial

FRONT COVER: The picture on the front cover is a stained glass window of St. Dominic (+1221) preaching to the Albigensian heretics whose stronghold was in the southwest of France. St. Dominic's Feast is celebrated on August 4th in the Old Roman Calendar and on August 8th in the New.



PHOTO above: This photograph of a rainbow appearing over our parish church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes was taken last Sunday evening, July 28th. The "rainbow in the heavens" has a special significance in the history of the 1858 Lourdes Apparitions. Bernadette received her First Apparition on Shrove Thursday (February 11th, 1858), the Thursday before Ash Wednesday. In the Matins Readings from the Divine Office that day, Noah and his family emerge from the Ark after the Great Flood to see the rainbow in the heavens as a sign of God's new covenant with the world. "And God said: This is the token of the covenant; I set it between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all generations to come. I will set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a token of the covenant between Me and the earth." (Gen. 9)



COLLECT ALMIGHTY everlasting God, who in the abundance of Thy kindness art wont to go beyond our merits and our prayers: pour down Thy mercy on us: forgive us aught whereof our conscience is afraid, and grant us all we dare not ask in prayer. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the First Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 15. 1-10. BRETHREN: I make known unto you the Gospel which I preached to you, which also you have received, and wherein you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast after what manner I preached unto you, unless you have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all, which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures; and that He was believed in until this present, but some are fallen asleep. After that He was seen by James, then by all the Apostles. And last of all He was seen also by me, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the Apostles, who am not worthy to be called an Apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am; and His grace in me hath not been void.

GRADUAL: Psalm 27:7. IN God hath my heart confided, and I have been helped; and my flesh hath flourished again; and with my will I will give praise to Him. Unto Thee have I cried, O Lord: O myGod, be not Thou silent: depart not from me. ALLELUIA: Psalm 80:2-3 Rejoice in God our helper: sing aloud to the God of Jacob, take a pleasant psalm with the harp. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Mark, 7. 31-37. **A**T THAT TIME, Jesus going out of the coasts of Tyre, came by Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis. And they bring to Him one deaf and dumb, and they besought Him that He would lay His hand upon him. And taking him from the multitude apart, He put His fingers into his ears, and spitting, He touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He groaned and said to him: Ephpheta, that is, Be thou opened: and immediately his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke right. And He charged them that they should tell no man: but the more He charged them so much the more a great deal did they publish it; and so much the more did they wonder, saying He hath done all things well; He hath made both the deaf to hear, and the dumb to speak.
