Pastor's Note



SAINT THOMAS OF VILLANOVA (+1555 A.D.)

September 22nd is observed as the Feast Day of St. Thomas of Villanova, Bishop & Confessor. His actual date of death, however, was on September 8th, the Feast of Mary's Nativity. the Octave Day of Our Lady's Nativity. As we read in the *Roman Martyrology*:

At Valencia in Spain, the birthday [to Heaven] of St. Thomas of Villanova, Bishop & Confessor, of the order of the Hermits of St. Augustine, distinguished by his ardent love for the poor. He was inscribed among the Saints by Pope Alexander VII, and his festival is observed on the 22nd of this month.

When he became the Bishop of Valencia (under obedience, and with great reluctance) in 1544, *"He changed nothing of his life; but gave free scope to his insatiable charity, and distributed the rich revenues of his church among the needy, keeping not so much as a bed for himself. For the bed on which he was lying when called to Heaven was lent to him by the person to whom he had shortly before given it in alms."* (Roman Breviary)

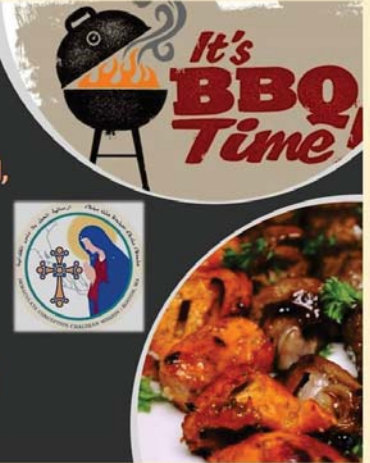
Thomas of Villanova was of the same religious order as Martin Luther: Augustinian. We might even see them as leading parallel lives. Luther lived from 1483-1546 (62 years): Thomas of Villanova from 1488-1555 (67 years). One Augustinian monk tore the Church apart: Luther launched his famous attack on many Catholic practices and the religious authority of the Roman Pope with his 95 theses, October 31st, 1517, the date considered to be the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. The other Augustinian monk, no less aware of the corruption and abuses in the Church, was a most faithful son of the Church: Thomas made his religious vows a few weeks after Luther's revolt, on November 25th, 1517, and lived a life of true evangelical witness to an heroic degree.

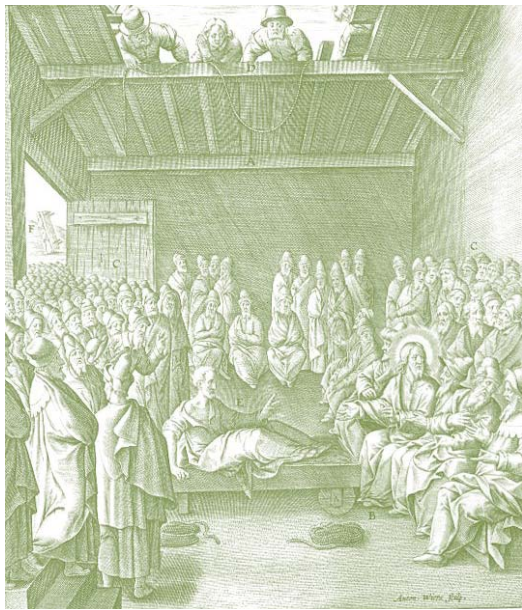

LATIN MASS PROPER: EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST



INTROIT: Ecclesiastes 36. 18. Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel. Ps. 121. 1. I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — Give peace ...

COLLECT LET Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and defend Thy Church: and because it cannot continue in safety without Thee, may it ever be governed by Thy goodness. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: From the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 1. 4-8. Brethren: I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Jesus Christ, that in all things you are made rich in Him in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you; so that

GOSPEL: Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, 9. 1-8. **At** that time Jesus, entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: Why do you think evil in your hearts? whether is easier to say: Thy sins are forgiven thee; or to say: Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy): Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose, and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it feared and glorified God who had given such power to men. —

OFFERTORY: Exodus 24. 4, 5. MOSES consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

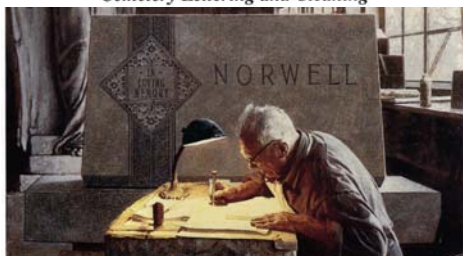
