MISSION APPEAL ON BEHALF OF "FATHER SALAKO'S MISSIONS"

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

Thank you so much for your generosity since the past years. Special thanks to Fr. Higgins and Fr.

LeBlanc for welcoming me as a priest and a missionary, as a confrère and a brother. God bless you.

Thanks to your benevolence, compassion and charity, we were able to install a solar system and build a pottery in the Seminary as you can see in the bulletin. We have also been able to pay the school fees of our seminarians.

Beyond the Seminary projects there are other on-going activities:

- ♦ Aside from the Training Center for teenage mothers, we have begun the dormitory for young boys. Our wish is that we complete the construction. Interior finishing and equipping this year 2025. In addition to what we have been able to raise locally, we would need an additional sum of \$10,000 for the equipment.
- ♦ Presently, we have 34 Seminarians studying philosophy. We would need the sum of \$17,000 for their educational charges (\$500 for each Seminarian). The preparatory year that is under the responsibility of the S.M.A. Province of Benin/Niger costs \$20,000 per year. We will be happy if you can help us with this.

- ♦ In our various villages of primary evangelization, where we bring the good news of salvation to our people, there is an urgent need for potable water so as to avoid diseases. We would greatly appreciate your support if you could aid us in creating access to clean water by drilling wells. We would need the sum of \$8,000 to be able to build one forage (drilling) in Niger.

The crisis affecting the globe is also affecting the countries of Benin and Niger. The crisis has led to the shut-down of the border between the two countries. The people are facing a serious economic challenge and the prices of goods and construction materials have tripled. The people of the Republic of Niger are in need of aid and support due to the *coup d'état* [last year]. The *coup* has created a humanitarian crisis, necessitating a response.

As you might have noticed, in the forthcoming years our focus will be on our Mission in Niger. There is a lot to be done there.

I appreciate your kindness and support. I am confident in your benevolence and your charitable spirit towards us and our Mission. To whom shall we go? To Jesus! Yes, and to you too, our brothers and sisters in the Faith. God bless you all!

LATIN MASS PROPER: TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

INTROIT (Ps. 54. 17, 18, 20, 23:2-3) WHEN I cried to the Lord He heard my voice, from them that draw near to me; and He humbled them, who is before all ages, and remains for ever: cast thy care upon the Lord, and He shall sustain Thee. *Ps. ibid.* 2. Hear, O God, my prayer, and despise not my supplication; be attentive to me and hear me. *Ÿ.* Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. — When I cried to the Lord ...

COLLECT O GOD, who dost manifest Thine almighty power mostly in sparing and showing mercy: multiply upon us Thy mercy: that as we hasten towards Thy promises, Thou mayest make us partakers of heavenly treasures. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE From the First Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians, 12. 2-11. BRETHREN, you know that, when you were heathens, you went to dumb idols, according as you were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man, speaking by the Spirit of God, saith Anathema to Jesus; and no man can say: The Lord Jesus, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of graces, but the same Spirit; and there are diversities of ministries, but the same Lord; and there are diversities of operations, but the same God, who worketh all in all. And the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man unto profit. To one indeed, by the Spirit, is given the word of wisdom; and to another, the word of knowledge, according to the same Spirit; to another faith in the same Spirit; to another the grace of healing in one Spirit; to another, the working of miracles; to another, prophecy; to another, the discerning of spirits; to another, divers kinds of tongues; to another, interpretation of speeches. But all these things one and the same Spirit worketh, dividing to every one according as He will.

GRADUAL (Ps. 16:8-2) KEEP me, O Lord, as the apple of Thine eye: protect me under the shadow of Thy wings. Let my judgment come forth from Thy countenance: let Thine eyes behold the thing that is equitable.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. (Ps. 64. 2.) A hymn, O God, becometh thee in Sion: and a vow shall be paid to Thee in Jerusalem. Alleluia.

GOSPEL Continuation of the holy Gospel according to St. Luke, 18. 9-14. AT THAT TIME, Jesus spoke this parable to some who trusted in themselves as just, and despised others. Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one was a pharisee, and the other a publican. The pharisee standing, prayed thus with himself: O God, I give Thee thanks that I am not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers; as also is this publican. I fast twice in the week; I give tithes of all that I possess. And the publican standing afar off would not so much as lift up his eyes towards heaven, but struck his breast saying: O God, be merciful to me a sinner. I say to you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

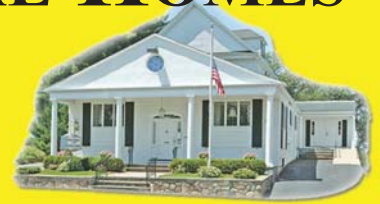

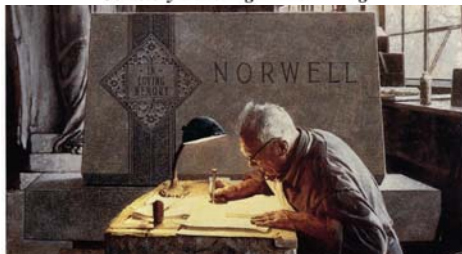

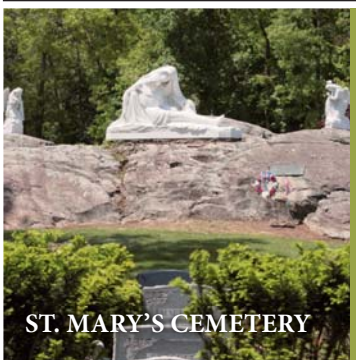
