Historical Note:

August 24th, A.D. 410

The Sack of Rome by Alaric the Goth

On this day in history the Barbarian chieftain Alaric the Goth conquered the City of Rome and subjected it to three days of sack and pillage. It was the first time in 800 years that Rome had been overthrown by a foreign invader. Christians saw in the event both a divine chastisement and a divine protection: chastisement for the revival of the pagan worship in Rome, protection for those who found refuge inside the basilicas of Saint Peter and St. Paul. While the Barbarians fired the pagan temples they left the churches of the Apostles intact and allowed them as places of sanctuary for all those Roman people who had fled therein.

Writing from Bethlehem where destitute Romans were arriving, St. Jerome wrote: *"The City which had taken the whole world was itself taken ... If Rome can perish, who can be safe?"*

St. Augustine's reproach of the Roman pagans whose lives were saved in the Sack of Rome by fleeing to the tombs of the Apostles, but who now (three years later) attack the Christian Church.

Many are so inflamed with hatred against [the City of God, the Church], and are so ungrateful to its Redeemer for His signal benefits, as to forget that they would now be unable to utter a single word to its prejudice, had they not found in its sacred places, as they fled from the enemy's steel, that life in which they now boast themselves. Are not those very Romans, who were spared by the barbarians through their respect for Christ, become enemies to the name of Christ? The reliquaries of the Martyrs and the churches of the Apostles bear witness to this; for in the sack of the City they were open sanctuary for all who fled to them, whether Christian or Pagan. To their very threshold the blood thirsty enemy raged; there his murderous fury owned a limit."
