Pastor's Note



(Front Cover: The Altar of Repose on the night of Maundy Thursday. At the Solemn Mass of the Lord's Supper the Blessed Sacrament is carried in procession to a specially prepared "Altar of Repose", adorned with flowers and lighted candles. The "night watch" of Eucharistic adoration on Holy Thursday commemorates the sufferings of Our Lord on the eve of His Passion, particularly the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, as He waited for Judas, His betrayer to come with the Temple Guard. THE MUSIC OF WORSHIP

As we continue to celebrate the joyous Easter Season I want to express my thanks on behalf of the whole parish to our parish choir and cantors for their contribution to the liturgies of Holy Week and Easter. The whole of our parish music program is under the direction of Mrs. Bobbie Hoffmann. Our parish choir

sings at the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Latin Mass each week as well as at all of the Solemn



liturgical celebrations throughout the year, from Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve to Holy Week. The choir has chosen a name as a group—the ANGELI CANTANTES, which translates literally as "Angels Singing". The meaning is a reference to the sublime sounds of the worship of Christ, the Lamb of God, which goes on in the liturgy of Heaven. (This is the vision of St. John in The Fourth Chapter of the Book of Revelation.) Our worship of God on earth in the Divine Liturgy is a communion with this perfect and beautiful worship of the angels and human saints in Heaven. Therefore it is a striving to "lift-up" and draw our human senses to "mind the things that are above, not the things that are upon the earth." (Colossians 3:2)

The music of the Church's Gregorian chants as well as the treasure trove of compositions which have been handed down to us through the ages are a tremendous aid to the act of worship. St. Augustine's famous saying, "He who sings, prays twice—Qui cantat, bis orat", is properly applied to the well-prepared, carefully executed music of formal liturgy. The dedication and generosity of our parish choir members who dedicate so many hours of time to this sacred music is a tremendous blessing for the whole parish. May we never take them for granted.






