## MAY IS THE MONTH OF OUR LADY MARY IMMACULATE



*(Front Cover: The Mystery of Pentecost—Christ in His glory in Heaven, sends forth His Spirit (the Holy Ghost, symbolized by the dove) down upon the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles and all of the disciples gathered together in the Upper Room.)*

### THE TWO SIDES OF GOD'S DIVINE WILL

Today's great Feast of Pentecost heralds the indwelling of Christ's own Spirit—the Third Person of the Holy Trinity, God the Holy Ghost—in the hearts of the Christian faithful. The “divine indwelling” is the reality of a soul regenerated by the Sacrament of Baptism and living in the state of grace. When we look at the Lives of the Saints for instruction and edification, we see how this divine indwelling manifests itself to an excellent degree.

The ordinary Christian, however, is called to allow this divine indwelling to prompt him to godly living. The Spirit of God living within us makes it possible for us to fulfill that petition of the Our Father: *“Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven.”* The question then becomes: how do I recognize the Will of God in order to do it?

In this, the distinction Catholic theology makes between the two sides, as it were, of God's will is very helpful. Theology distinguishes between “God's Will Signified” and the “The Will of God's Good Pleasure.” What do they mean?

The Will Signified has to do with all that is clearly commanded to us in natural law, divine law, and the positive law of the Church. God's indicates His Will to us through His Commandments and the legitimate use of human authority. The Will Signified encompasses everything that is of obligation. Thus, for example, a married person understands the Will Signified as living the married state according to morality and good sense.

**The Will of God's Good Pleasure is more** personal to us and requires a real prayer life. What would God *like* me to do beyond what is of obligation? A work of charity? An educational project? It could be as great as the choice for my state-of-life or as small as an inspiration that I should reach out to someone with a phone call at a given moment. And it is happening every day of our lives on earth, in ways both great and small. Beyond the call of duty—*“Lord, what do You want me to do in this...Is it my own ego fantasizing away?...or is it Your prompting, Your Holy Spirit?”*

The crucial point is that God does not use the second side of His Will to nullify the first. If the “spirit” is urging us to do something which would harm our clear duties—like a family man who thinks God calls him away from his family in order to go on retreats all the time—then we can be reasonably sure it is not the Holy Spirit. When in doubt, it is always better to err on the side of God's Will Signified than to risk harm to ourselves and others by acting out on a false inspiration.

And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers ton-gues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, de-vout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the mul-titude came together, and were con-founded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galileans? And how have we heard every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians and Medes, and Ela-mites, and inhabitants of Meso-potamia, Judea and Cap-padocia, Pontus and Asia, Phry-gia, and Pamphylia, Egypt, and the parts of Lybia about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also and Proselytes, Cretes and Arabians; we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

**FIRST ALLELUIA: Psalm 103: 30** Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Send forth Thy Spirit, and they shall be created, and Thou shalt renew the face of earth.

But the Para-clete, the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you: I go away, and I come unto you. If you loved Me, you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father: for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it come to pass: that when it shall come to pass you may believe. I will not now speak many things with you. For the prince of this world cometh, and in Me he hath not anything. But that the world may know that I love the Father, and as the Father hath given Me commandment so do I.


