

(Front Cover: “Vierge du Rosaire”—the Virgin of the Rosary—by Louis Brea, (1458-1523 A.D. The Feast of the Assumption, August 15th, which we celebrate this week, marks the beginning of the heavenly life of Mary.)

THE NORTH AMERICAN CORTEGE OF SAINTS

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven, body and soul, places Mary at the head of the whole cortege or procession of saints which follows after Christ the Lord. In that cortege we find saints of North America who reflect our own heritage. Here follows the list of Saints and Blesseds of North America whose feast-days are currently observed in the dioceses of the USA. (They begin in December to reflect the cycle of the Church’s Year, from Advent to Advent.) *(Fr. Higgins)*



St. JUAN DIEGO “Talking Eagle”, Confessor. The native convert from the Chichimeca people who received the 4 visions of Our Lady of Guadalupe and whose cloak was left with the miraculous impression of her in 1531. (Canonized in 2002.)



St. ELIZABETH ANN SETON, Holy Widow, January 4th, +1821. A Catholic convert, she founded the first congregation of religious women in the USA, the Sisters of Charity, devoted to education of the poor and teaching in parochial schools. In 1975, she became the first native-born American citizen to be canonized.



St. JOHN NEUMANN, Bishop & Confessor, January 5th, +1860. Missionary bishop from Bohemia (present-day Czech Republic) and Bishop of Philadelphia. Promoter of Catholic parochial schools in USA. (Canonized in 1977.)



St. ANDRE BESSETTE (Frere Andre), the ‘Miracle Man of Montreal’, Confessor, January 6th, +1937. Founded the Oratory of St. Joseph. (Canonized in 2010.)




St. KATHERINE DREXEL, Virgin, March 3rd, +1955. Philadelphia heiress and foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. She established some 49 Foundations, including Xavier University in New Orleans. (Canonized in 2000.)



St. DAMIEN DE VEUSTER, Confessor, “Damien the Leper”, May 10th, +1889. A Belgian Missionary priest of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary to Hawaii, he volunteered to go as a priest to the leper colony at Moloka’i. Eventually he too developed leprosy and died from it. (Canonized in 2009.)



SS. CRISTOBAL MAGALLANES & COMPANIONS, Martyrs, May 21st, +1915-1937. Fr. Cristobal Magallanes, 21 diocesan priests, and 3 laymen were either shot or hanged by the revolutionary Mexican government for their association with the Cristero uprising.




Blessed JUNIPERO SERRA, Confessor, July 1st, +1784. Franciscan missionary priest to Upper California, he founded nine missions among the native peoples.



Blessed KATERI TEKAKWITHA, Virgin, "Lily of the Mohawks", July 14th, +1680. Led a life of great austerity and charity in spite of the persecution she endured as a Christian. (To be canonized this year.) In 1980, she became the first among the indigenous tribal people of North America to be beatified by the Catholic Church.



Blessed MARIE-ROSE DU ROCHER, Virgin, October 6th, +1849. Born in St. Antoine, Quebec, she began the first Canadian parish Sodality for young women, and founded the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary for Christian education.



SS. JEAN DE BREBEUF, ISAAC JOGUES & COMPANIONS (THE NORTH AMERICAN MARTYRS), Martyrs, October 19th (September 26th in 1962 Missal), +1642-1649. French Jesuit and oblate missionaries to the Hurons and Iroquois tribes of North America.



St. FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI, Virgin, "Mother Cabrini", November 13th, +1917. Foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. She labored for 28 years in the USA and South America in a ministry directed at poor Italian migrants abroad. She established some 67 institutions (schools, hospitals, and orphanages). In 1946, she became the first U.S. citizen to be canonized.



Blessed MIGUEL AGUSTIN PRO, Priest & Martyr, November 23rd, +1927. During the Mexican Revolution, accused of plotting against the government. At the point of his execution, he cried out: "LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING!"



LATIN MASS TEXTS

Traditional Propers

Eleventh Sunday After Pentecost

Vestments: Green

INTROIT: Psalm 67: 6-7, 36 God in His holy place; God who maketh men of one mind to dwell in a house: He shall give power and strength to His people. *Psalm 67: 2.* Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered: and let them that hate Him flee from before His face. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Almighty and eternal God, who in the abundance of Thy loving kindness art wont to give beyond the deserts and desires of those who humbly pray; pour down upon us Thy mercy, forgiving us these things of which our conscience is afraid, and granting us those blessings which we dare not presume to ask. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE: 1 Corinthians 15: 1-10 Brethren: I make known unto you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you have received, and wherein you stand, by which also you are saved, if you hold fast after what manner I preached unto you, unless you have believed in vain. For I delivered unto you first of all, which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures; and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures; and that He was seen by Cephas, and after that by the eleven. Then was He seen by more than five hundred brethren at once; of whom many remain until this present, and some are fallen asleep. After that He was seen by James then by all the apostles. And last of all He was seen also by me, as by one born out of due time. For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God; but by the grace of God I am what I am; and His grace in me hath not been void.

GRADUAL: Psalm 27: 7, 1 In God hath my heart confided, and I have been helped; and my flesh hath flourished again; and with my will I will give praise

to Him. *V.* Unto Thee will I cry, O Lord: O my God, be not Thou silent; depart not from me.

ALLELUIA: Psalm 80: 2-3 Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* Rejoice to God our helper; sing aloud to the God of Jacob; take a pleasant psalm with the harp. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Mark 7: 31-37 At that time, Jesus going out of the coasts of Tyre, came by Sidon to the sea of Galilee, through the midst of the coasts of Decapolis. And they bring to Him one deaf and dumb, and they besought Him that He would lay His hand upon him. And taking him from the multitude apart, He put His fingers into his ears, and spitting, He touched his tongue; and looking up to heaven, He groaned and said to him: Ephphetha, which is, Be thou opened: and immediately his ears were opened, and the string of his tongue was loosed, and he spoke right. And He charged them that they should tell no man: but the more He charged them so much the more a great deal did they publish it; and so much the more did they wonder, saying: He hath done all things well; He hath made both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak.

OFFERTORY: Psalm 29: 2-3 I will extol Thee, O Lord, for Thou hast upheld me; and hast not made my enemies to rejoice over me: O Lord, I have cried to Thee, and Thou hast healed me.


