THE CONGREGATION OF OUR LADY OF MESOPATAMIA

Two years ago, as we were celebrating All Saints Day, the news reported a particularly bloody attack on a Catholic Church in Baghdad, Iraq. On October 31st, 2010, a group of Islamist commandos attacked the Syriac-rite Catholic cathedral of Our Lady of Salvation while the congregation was full of worshippers. What ensued was a massacre within the church. As, perhaps, some of you will recall, we prayed for these suffering Iraqi Christians at our All Saints Day Masses that year.

Since the American and Allied invasion which toppled the despotism of Saddam Hussein in

2003, the native Christians of Iraq, who trace their faith back to the preaching of St. Thomas the Apostle, have been the targets of Islamist fanaticism.

The flight of native Christians from Iraq has accelerated on account of this bloody persecution. Many have settled in our state.

The Archdiocese of Boston has approved an Iraqi exile-group Syriac-rite congregation "Our Lady of Mesopotamia" to operate out of one of our archdiocesan parishes. Until recently, the Iraqis have worshipped once a month at Corpus Christi church in Newton. With Korean Catholic Community's move to take over Corpus Christi Church, the Iraqi Community is looking for another church home. At their request, I have welcomed them to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes for their monthly Divine Liturgy (Mass), which will usually take place on a Saturday evening after our 4 p.m. Vigil Mass. It is my understanding that some of the members of this congregation are survivors of that October 2010 massacre in Our Lady of Salvation Cathedral. The people we prayed for half-way around the world then have now found refuge in our parish church of Mary Immaculate of Lourdes.

CATHOLICS OF THE SYRIAN RITE

The arrival of the Iraqi exile community of Our Lady of Mesopotamia to Mary Immaculate of Lourdes brings us into direct contact with one of the ancient forms of liturgy of the world-wide communion of the Catholic Church. Their Divine Liturgy (the Mass) is called the "Liturgy of St. James". Its origins are in the Church of Antioch, the city where the disciples were first called "Christians" after



the preaching of the Gospel. This liturgy has remained substantially unchanged since the 4th century A.D. The Catholics of the Syrian (or Syriac) Rite are in Communion with the Pope in Rome, but they are governed by their own canon law and have their own Patriarch and hierarchy.







Vestments: Green

INTROIT: Jeremiah 29: 11, 12, 14 The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all places. *Psalm 84: 2* Lord, Thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. *V.* Glory be to the Father.

COLLECT Stir up the wills of Thy faithful people, we beseech Thee, O Lord: that more earnestly seeking the fruit of good works, they may receive more abundantly the gifts of Thy loving kindness. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: Colossians 1: 9-14. Brethren: We cease not to pray for you, and to beg that you may be filled with the knowledge of the will of God, in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; that you may walk worthy of God, in all things pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; strengthened with all might according to the power of His glory, in all patience and long suffering with joy; giving thanks to God the Father; who hath made us worthy to be partakers of the lot of the saints in light; who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the remission of sins.

GOSPEL: Matthew 24: 15-35 At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: When you shall see the abomination of desolation, which was spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place; (he that readeth, let him understand) then they that are in Judea, let them flee to the mountains; and he that is on the house-top, let him not come down to take anything out of his house; and he that is in the field, let him not go back to take his coat. And woe to them that are with child, and that give suck, in those days. But pray that your flight be not in the winter, or on the sabbath: for there shall be then great tribulation, such as hath not been found from the beginning of the world until now neither shall be: and unless those days

had been shortened, no flesh should be saved; but for the sake of the elect, those days shall be shortened. Then if any man shall say to you: Lo, here is Christ, or there; do not believe him; for there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch as to deceive (if possible) even the elect. Behold I have told it to you beforehand: if therefore they shall say to you: Behold He is in the desert, go ye not out; behold He is in the closets, believe it not. For as lightning cometh out of the east, and appeareth even into the west, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. Wheresoever the body shall be, there shall the eagles also be gathered together. And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven, and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn; and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with much power and majesty; and He shall send His angels with a trumpet and a great voice, and they shall gather together His elect from the four winds, from the farthest parts of the heavens to the utmost bounds of them. And from the fig-tree learn a parable: when the branch thereof is now tender, and the leaves come forth, you know that summer is nigh. So you also, when you shall see all these things, know ye that it is nigh even at the doors. Amen I say to you that this generation shall not pass till all these things be done.
